1. Exercise (2TP + 2TP)

Consider

$$x' = f(x), (1)$$

with $f: \mathbb{R}^d \to \mathbb{R}^d$ and prove the following statements.

- a) If f is dissipative, then every fixed point of (1) is stable.
- b) If f is strictly dissipative w.r.t. the scalar product $\langle \cdot, \cdot \rangle$ in the sense that there exists a constant $\mu > 0$, such that

$$\langle f(x) - f(\bar{x}), x - \bar{x} \rangle \le -\mu |x - \bar{x}|^2 \qquad \forall x, \bar{x} \in \mathbb{R}^d$$
 (2)

holds, then every fixed point of f is asymptotically stable. Hint: Use Gronwall lemma to show that

$$|\phi^t x - \phi^t \bar{x}| \le e^{-\mu t} |x - \bar{x}| \tag{3}$$

holds for $t \geq 0$ and all $x, \bar{x} \in \mathbb{R}^d$.

2. Exercise (4TP)

Let $\psi: \mathbb{R}^d \to \mathbb{R}^d$ be continuously differentiable and have the fixed point

$$\psi(x^*) = x^*.$$

If $\rho(D\psi(x^*)) < 1$, then x^* is an asymptotically stable fixed point of the recursion $x_{k+1} = \psi(x_k), \ k = 0, 1, \dots$.

3. Exercise (4TP)

Let $\Psi^{\tau}: \mathbb{R}^n \to \mathbb{R}^n$ the discrete flow operator of the implicit trapezoidal rule with stepsize τ as applied to the linear system

$$x'(t) = Ax(t).$$

a) Show that Ψ^{τ} can be written as

$$\Psi^{\tau} = R(\tau A),$$

with a rational function R of the matrix τA .

b) Derive sufficient conditions on τ for the A-stability of Ψ^{τ} . Is asymptotic stability inherited from the continuous problem?
